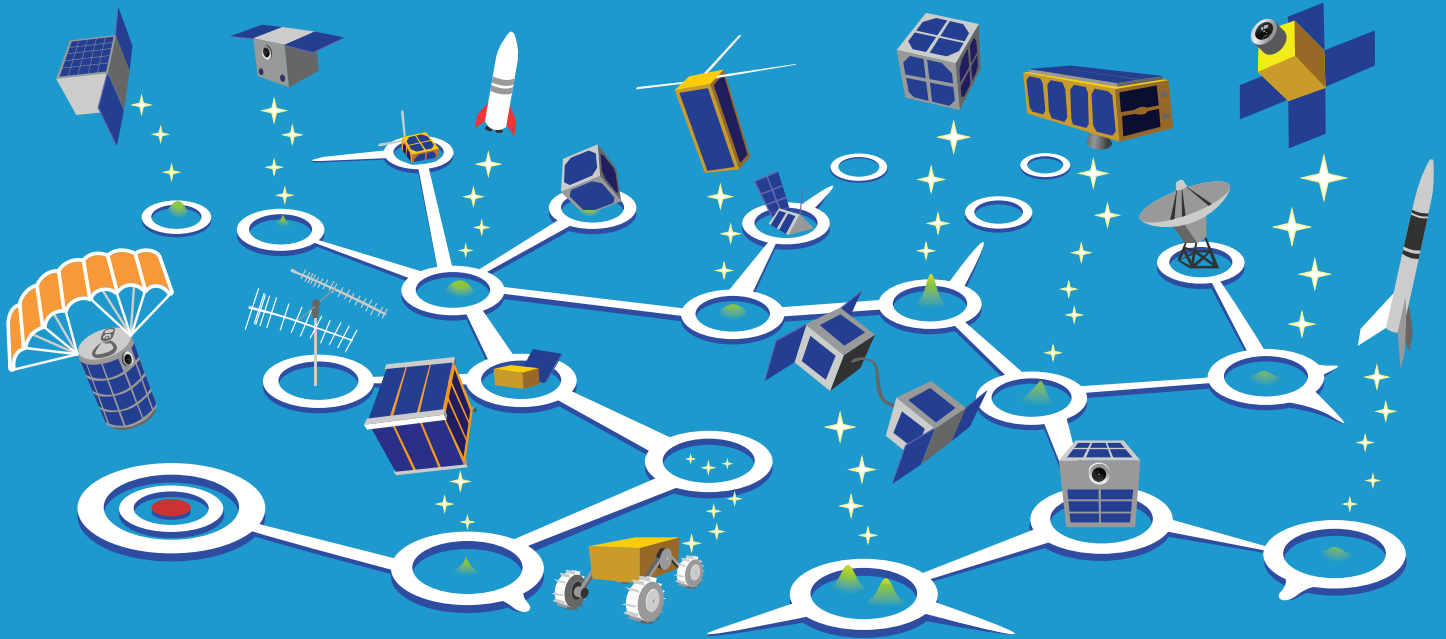

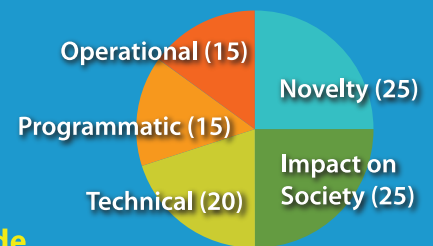
Encourage innovative exploitation of micro/nano-satellites to provide useful capabilities, services, or data.
